ATHLETICS UPDATE ...

OLMC Athletics has had a great start to the 2018-2019 season! Our volleyball program just finished its season, with both teams JV and Varsity, having very competitive performances. The Junior Varsity team, coached by Bob Del Camp, went 7 and 7 and made the playoffs. They finished 4th in the league and in the playoffs gave the eventual champions a very tough time. They played every game with energy. In one game Coach Del Camp had only 5 girls available to play the first set. The girls stepped up and took their opponents to 26 points before they lost. The Athletic Department and the school is very proud of their consistent play and accomplishments. Our Varsity Team, last year's League Champions, fought hard and had some very positive moments. Coach Theo Zulueta did a great job of rebuilding the team after losing 3 all-stars and a total of 5 players from last year's team. The girls finished with a record of 8 and 13, but the record is very deceiving. Four of the games were very close and could have gone either way. The team peaked at one of South Jersey's strongest middle school tournaments. The finished in 2nd Place at the St. Joan of Arc Classic in Marlton taking the eventual tournament champions right to the final set. The season was a success as the girls played hard and did a great job of representing the school. The Athletic Department and the School would like to thank the parents for their continual support. All of us wish the 8th graders the best of luck and success as they move on to high school.

Boys Basketball practice starts up in November. Coach Joe Ranoia is getting his varsity team ready to play and feels the team will be very competitive. Coach Ranoia has some very talented returning 7th and 8th graders and the season is looking very positive. The Junior Varsity program needs some additional help. Our plan is to develop the young players but we can't develop talent unless the children show up. So parents please contact Coach Ranoia or our athletic director Mr. Gulla if you think your child would be interested in playing. League games will start in December so there's still plenty of time if your son is interested.

Girls Basketball started in October with open gym clinics. Team practices just started in November and the program looks like it's going to be successful. Every practice night we have had 10 to 12 girls show up, and the girls seem to be enjoying every minute. Our girl's coaching staff, Coach Gulla and Coach McGrath, strive to teach the basic fundamentals skills that are necessary to develop successful basketball players. The coaches are determined to develop a solid program that is competitive. Rebuilding is difficult when all of last year's team graduated. This year the girl's basketball program will consist of a Junior Varsity team built around 5th and 6th graders and one 7th grader, and a Cadet program that will be based with 3rd and 4th graders.
